MSOL – Master of Science in Organizational Leadership

Building on the disciplines of philosophy, social sciences, law, management, finance, psychology and research, Wheeling Jesuit University's graduate program in Organizational Leadership develops the intellectual and personal skills required of managers and executives in today's and future organizations.

Graduates of the program demonstrate the following: a proven capacity to be creative and skilled at problem solving, a sophisticated ability to learn and work in groups, superior interpersonal and communication skills, and visionary leadership and learning skills.

COURSES IN THE ACCELERATED MSOL PROGRAM ARE BROKEN INTO FIVE FOUNDATIONS:

- + Leadership Foundations include Concepts of Leadership, Leader as a Change Agent, and Leading with Integrity and Creativity
- + Environmental Dimensions include The Legal Environment, Government, Community and Strategic Partnership Development
- + Structural Dimensions include Financial Analysis, Marketing Analysis, Process Analysis and Quality Management
- + Personal Dimensions include Leader as a Communicator, Motivator Thinker/Visionary and Leader and Spirituality
- + Thesis includes Project Management and Research Methods components



Program Benefits

This accelerated master of science degree in organizational leadership serves the career interests of individuals and the competitive interest of business in the following ways:

- + Students attend class an average of one night per week for 22 months while also completing out-of-class readings and assignments
- + Students advance through the entire program with the same cohesive learning group
- + Classes are structured in a modular format, meaning students consistently build upon what was learned in previous courses
- + Master's thesis is an applied research project using a real-world setting requiring corrective action or a new initiative
- + Every module may be directly tied to the needs and objectives of the student's employer or organization

Admission Requirements

- + A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university
- + A minimum 2.75 undergraduate GPA
- + A scaled score of 400 on the Miller Analogies Test (MAT)
- + A minimum of three years full-time professional work experience or evidence of significant work/life experience documented by a current resumé
- + An interview may be required to finalize the admission process
- + MAT score is waived for WJU graduates with a 3.0 GPA or students with an earned master's degree
